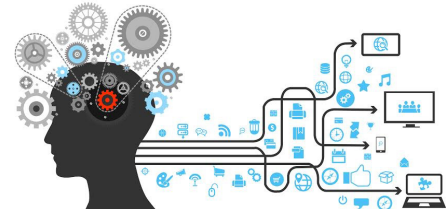

Chris Rees will speak about Ethics, and the practical issues that confront us in IT when ethical considerations arise. He will focus on the ethics of Artificial Intelligence and the ethical problems that this fast developing technology raises. He will then discuss how and when ethics should be considered, the obstacles to doing so, and how they may be overcome.



Chris is President of the British Computer Society, the Chartered Institute for IT in the UK and a senior member of the School of Economic Science in London. He has worked in England and the US for such companies as IBM, Dun & Bradstreet, Logica and Deloitte Consulting.

In October 1996, he co-founded Charteris plc. leading consulting engagements for clients such as National Air Traffic Services (NATS), UNESCO and Centrica. Chris led Charteris' Expert Witness practice for many years and acted as an expert in many high profile disputes. He retired in 2015

A Chartered Fellow of the BCS, Chris co-founded and chaired its Financial Services Special Interest Group.

He is now a Court Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of Information Technologists, the City of London Livery Company and chairs their Ethical and Spiritual Development Panel.

With Paul Palmarozza he co-authored the book 'From Principles to Profit - The Art of Moral Management' (Duckworth, London 2006).
